

CAMPSITE PORT SAINTE MARIE – MALICORNE SUR SARTHE

INFORMATION AND RULES

1 - Opening : The campsite is open from the first week-end of April to the end of September.

2 – Admission : You must have the authorization of the reception supervisor to enter and to stay on the campsite. You must stay at the pitch indicated to you by the supervisor. If you enter the campsite, it is implied that you have read the rules and agree to abide by them. You may be asked to leave the campsite if you break the rules, and in the case of serious breaches the supervisor may call the police.

3 – Formalities : Everyone who spends at least one night on the campsite must produce his/her identity papers and complete the administrative formalities.

Children under the age of 18 can't stay on the site unaccompanied. They must be with an adult and produce a parental authorization when they stay without their family. They are under their parents' responsibility (or the persons who are in charge of them) at all times on the campsite.

Pets are authorized on the campsite subject to production of a valid anti-rabies vaccination certificate in conformity with the ministerial By-Law of January 22nd 1985. Cats and dogs have to be tattooed and wear a collar with the name of the owner. According to Civil French Law, dogs belonging to category 1 or 2 are prohibited on the campsite.

Vehicles with double-axle are not authorized to enter and stay on the site.

4 – Reception : You will find information there about the campsite facilities and all the information necessary to enjoy your stay. The tourist office is also at your disposal to answer all your questions. The opening hours, campsite rates and rules are posted at reception. Do not hesitate to ask for details.

Campsite bookings and client details are stored on a computer. Recorded information is strictly reserved for the use of the campsite management. In accordance with article 39 onward of Law N° 78-17 of January 6th 1978 relating to computer science, to files and freedom, every person can have access to, and if need be, correct or remove information concerning him/her by contacting service reception.

5 – Charges : Charges are fixed by the town council according to the number of nights spent on the campsite. Visitors' tax is due from April to September inclusive. Campers are asked to inform reception when they will be leaving on the day before their anticipated departure. Those who intend leaving early before the reception opens should also pay the day before they leave.

6 – Practical life : Campers are asked to respect the privacy and enjoyment of the other people on the campsite, in particular in respect of noise nuisances either by shouting or with loud music etc... Please close your cars doors quietly !

For safety reasons, there is an absolute speed limit within the campsite of 10 kph. No vehicles may be moved between 10 p.m. to 8 a.m. and the access gate is locked during this time. Only one car is authorized on a leasehold pitch. You may receive visitors on the campsite but they must be registered with reception by the pitch holder. A charge is made for such visits prior to allowing access to the campsite. Visitors do not have free access to the swimming pool. Their car must remain outside the perimeter of the campsite.

Pitches are only for 7 people maximum and 1 car. You may set up a little tent on the pitch but the limit of 7 people may not be exceeded.

The campsite is to be absolutely quiet between 10 p.m. and 8 a.m. Pets are to be kept under control at all times and should be kept on a lead. They must not be left unattended on the campsite at anytime. The owner is responsible for them under French Civil law.

It's expressly forbidden to park on any access roads and on pitches not relating to the tenancy. The campsite is equipped with sanitation for the disabled and mothers with their babies. It is reserved for their use. Please take care of it !

7 – Tidiness of the campsite : Everyone is asked to respect the cleanliness and hygiene of the campsite. It is forbidden to empty waste water on the ground or in the drains. Caravan users should use the proper facilities provided. Domestic rubbish, glass, plastic and papers must be put into the bins provided at the entrance. Sanitation must be kept clean at all times. Washing up and washing are strictly forbidden outside of the reserved sinks. Hanging out of washing is permitted up until 10 a.m. near the shelters if it is unobtrusive and not disturbing to others. It's forbidden to hang it from the trees.

You are asked to respect any flowerbeds and trees, do not cut branches from the trees or put nails in them to hang things on. You are not allowed to delimit your pitch by personal means nor by the digging of trenches. When you leave your pitch at the end of your stay, please leave it clean, as you would wish to have find it on arrival. Electric wires and extension leads must not cross the roads.

The campsite accepts no liability for theft, fire, bad weather etc...or for incidents incurring the civil liability of campsite residents. It is the campsite resident's responsibility to arrange the necessary insurance cover.

8 – Security : Open fires and alcohol or petrol stoves are strictly forbidden. Fire extinguishers are at your disposal. In case of fire, please inform the supervisor immediately. There is a first aid kit at the reception. A call-box is adjacent to the reception. Campers should have adequate safety equipment at all times. Under French Law, parents are responsible for their children who are therefore to be supervised at all times. They should not play near the camp installations.

9 – Particular conditions : Days are counted from 12 o'clock midday, and partial days are counted complete for payment calculations. Caravans may not be left in storage at the campsite without the express approval of the supervisor. They are to be left at a spot designated by him or her and a charge is payable.

The owner of the caravan is wholly responsible for its security with no liability in any form on the part of the campsite owners or employees.

10 – The campsite supervisor is responsible for the order and good running of the campsite. He/she has authority to demand compliance with the campsite regulations and people not respecting them may be evicted from the campsite (if necessary with the help of the police).

A suggestion box is provided at the reception, for improvements or for registering complaints, but comments will only be considered if they are signed and dated.
